
I got a new tag for him, returned yours.. Anyway, he's good, improving all the time. Here he is..



We received May's paperwork today thank you. As you see May mounded up the bedding, got the toys at arm's length, made herself comfortable and had a good chew.

She is feeling a lot more relaxed, as are we.

Just a few lines to put your mind at rest, paper work received and May is moving along. Update on Vet progress (ears, groin) Monday. We put the appointment back from today to Monday as I dropped the ear cleaning from twice daily to once a day. She was getting sore. She indicated by gentle resistance. No growling or aggressive behaviour. So, it takes a few days longer. We are at the very beginning of a long journey. She needs to trust. If I was cleaning a wound and possibly infection was building, I would push on but it's yeasty ears



Good morning Sue,

The car journey was fine. He made loads of eye contact with Carol in the car. Jumped out when we arrived home and explored the front garden. He then went into the house and out into the back garden. Explored everywhere. He's found his favourite spot in the sitting room on the deep pile rug (ignoring his bed).

He's had all his meds, eaten all his dinner, had his antibiotic and the antiseptic cream rubbed in. He's drinking loads of water as well.

He definitely has abandonment issues as we experimented by both of us going upstairs, we could see him pacing up and down the hall into the kitchen. He was very agitated, and we could hear little whines. We decided to bring him upstairs, but he was very nervous, and I had to carry him. He's made himself very comfortable on our bedroom floor on a fleece rug (he definitely likes a rug). He was wandering between the bedroom, landing and bathroom where we'd placed his water bowl.

At around 1am he was pacing so we both helped him down the stairs. Very nervous again but he managed the last few steps. He went outside, did his business and when Carol went back up the stairs and I started to follow he basically ran up the stairs by himself. He's a very fast learner!

In the next few days, we'll start his training, and teach him to sit, lie down and get back up. We'll also use hand signals so that he'll recognise the commands if he's away from us (when he is allowed off the lead). We'll try making him wait to eat his food as well. We'll also teach him to stop and wait at kerbs. This is all in the lead up to teaching recall for when he's off the lead. Luckily, where we'll be taking him walking has two fully enclosed fields, but I don't think he'll stray far from us. He's become very attached already. And he definitely smiles \bigcirc .

Thank you for the gift of this wonderful addition to our family. He's completed the home.




